Global Programs at Penn State



Welcome to Penn State's International Profile 2010. This publication comprises an array of statistics and information about the impressive international facets of Penn State as a Global University, featuring numbers on students studying abroad, international students and scholars on campus, and participants in the Intensive English Communication Program.

The University Office of Global Programs (UOGP), as the home for all international initiatives at Penn State, oversees education abroad programs; hosts international students, scholars, and international visitors; and provides support for the University's international partnerships and collaborations around the world. Since the early '70s, this office has compiled data on international students enrolled at Penn State; in recent years, similar data has been collected for students on Education Abroad programs. The data is gathered to coincide with the statistical standard in the field of international education, the Institute of International Education's annual publication, Open Doors.

According to this year's edition of Open Doors, Penn State ranked ninth in the nation among doctorate institutions in numbers of students on study abroad in 2008-09 (the last year for which data is available) and sixth in sending students on mid-length (semester) education abroad programs. The University moved from 25th in 2008-09 to 18th in 2009-10 among institutions hosting international students. Also during that academic year, Penn State had the highest number of international students (4,561) for any higher education institution in Pennsylvania.

Open Doors reported that nationwide the number of American students studying abroad experienced a slight decrease (less than 1%) in 2008-09. This is the first time in 25 years that the number declined, but this was offset by the fact that students are studying in more diverse locations. Penn State has similar trends, with only ten of the top 25 destination countries being in Europe. The increasing numbers of students taking advantage of these programs is encouraging.

The number of international students at colleges and universities in the United States increased by 3% for a new record high in the 2009-10 academic year, according to Open Doors. Similar to the nation-wide 30% increase, the Chinese student population at Penn State rose by 27.6% to 1,640, more than double the number of any other international contingent at the University.

In addition to enhanced diversity and multicultural perspective, international students also bring significant revenues to the local and state economy. Pennsylvania is the fifth highest state in the nation in total contributions from international students (being exceeded only by California, New York, Texas, and Massachusetts).

The figures in the table below, taken from the NAFSA: Association of International Educators *The Economic Benefits of International Education to the United States: A Statistical Analysis, 2009-2010*, shows that international students and their dependents contributed more than \$18.7 billion to the U.S. economy during the 2009-10 academic year. The contribution of Penn State's international students accounted for more than 15% of the economic impact in Pennsylvania, and, by itself, is greater than the total economic impact in 20 of the states listed in the report.

International faculty and scholars add another dimension of expertise and cultural perspective—a resource of immeasurable value. This year for the first time, the International Profile includes a report on Fulbright scholars at Penn State—both visiting scholars coming to the University and Penn State faculty receiving grants. Penn State has traditionally been a leader in producing faculty Fulbrights; this year, 16 faculty and staff were honored with grants. In the past ten years, 164 faculty have garnered grants in 70 countries.

Education Abroad Highlights for 2009-10

- With this edition of the *International Profile*, statistics are being tracked separately for embedded (or short-term) Education Abroad programs.
- In 2009-10, 2,563 Penn State students took part in Education Abroad programs in 54 countries.
- 1,648 students participated in semester and year-long Education Abroad programs; an additional 915 took part in embedded (short term) programs.
- Nationwide, 54.6% of students studying abroad participated in embedded or short-term programs in 2008-09; in the same year, 37.3% of Penn State students studying overseas were on embedded programs.
- Penn State experienced a slight decrease in students studying abroad in 2009-10, a less than 1% decline from the previous year.
- Colleges sending the largest numbers of students to study abroad include business administration (25.4%) and liberal arts (24.6%), followed by health and human development (8.4%), arts and architecture (8.1%), and communications (8.1%).
- The five most popular destinations with Penn State Education Abroad participants are Italy (450 participants), Spain (239), United Kingdom (122), France (101), and the Netherlands (76).
- Seniors and juniors were the majority of participants (more than 90%) in semester and year-long programs, while embedded programs attracted a greater range of academic levels, including graduate students, who made up 17% of those participants.
- Female students continue to be the majority of participants in semester/full year programs (61.5%), but embedded programs participation had an almost even number with 51% female, 49% male.
- While a large percentage of students, 71.3%, on semester and full year programs chose destinations in Europe, by comparison, only 54.2% of students in embedded programs studied in Europe, with corresponding larger numbers in other regions (see page 12).
- The range of GPA for students who received merit-based Education Abroad funding was 2.87 to 4.0.
- 106 students received funding from Grant-in-Aid scholarships with an average award of \$933.
- 39 of 89 applicants received Diversity Grants-in-Aid with an average award of \$1,474.
- 57 students received Whole World Scholarships (funding for non-traditional destinations): those in full year programs received \$2,000; semester programs, \$1,000; and summer programs, \$500.
- Penn State—University Park ranked ninth in 2008-09 among research universities and fourth among CIC institutions for number of study abroad enrollments. (*Note: 2008-09 is the most recent data published by IIE.*)

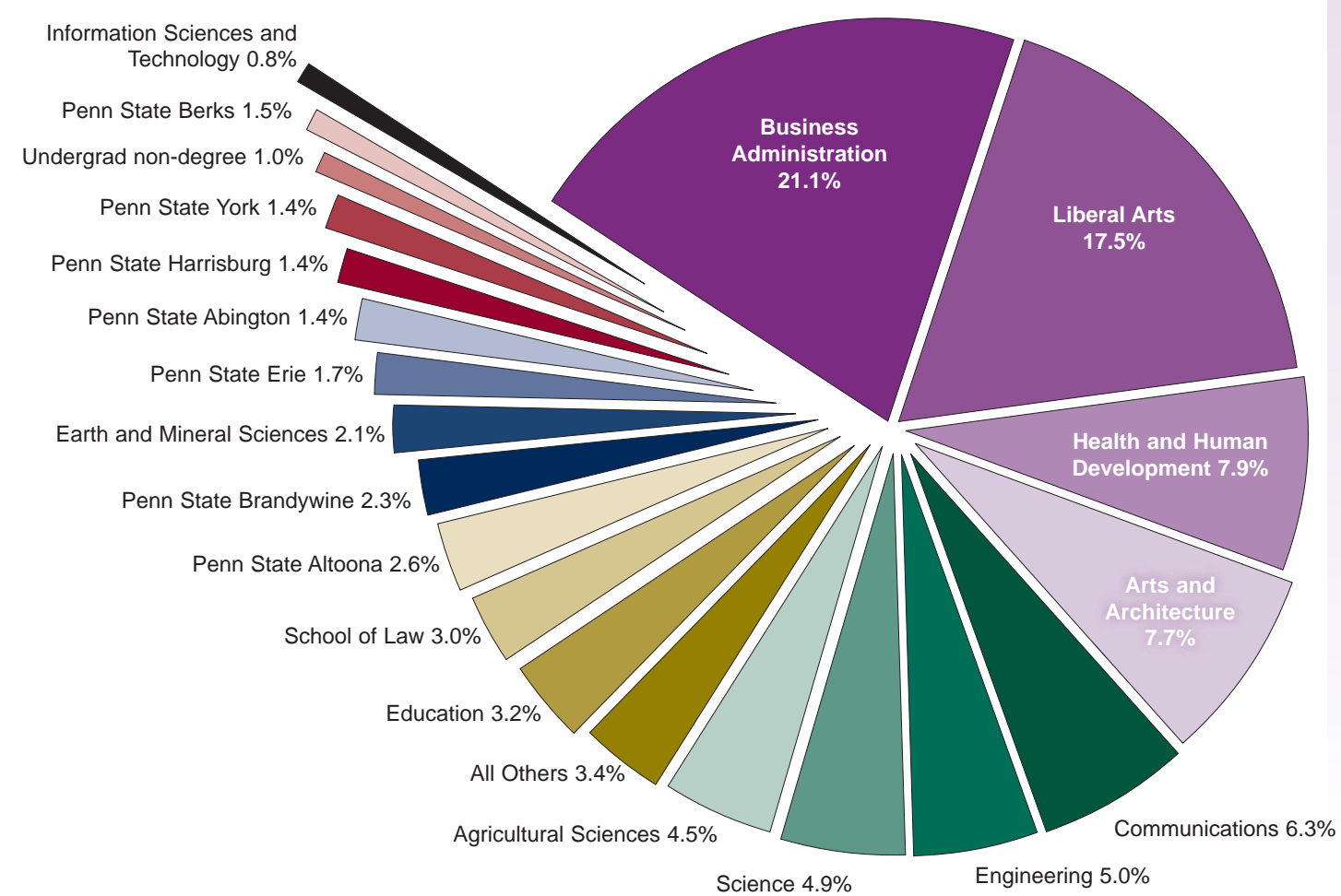

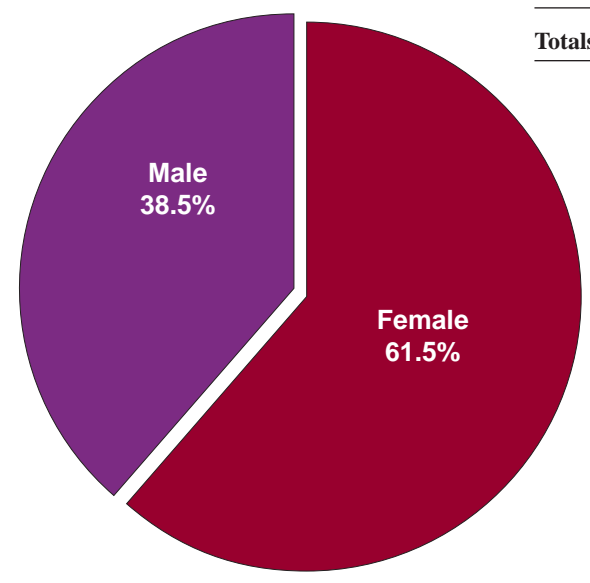

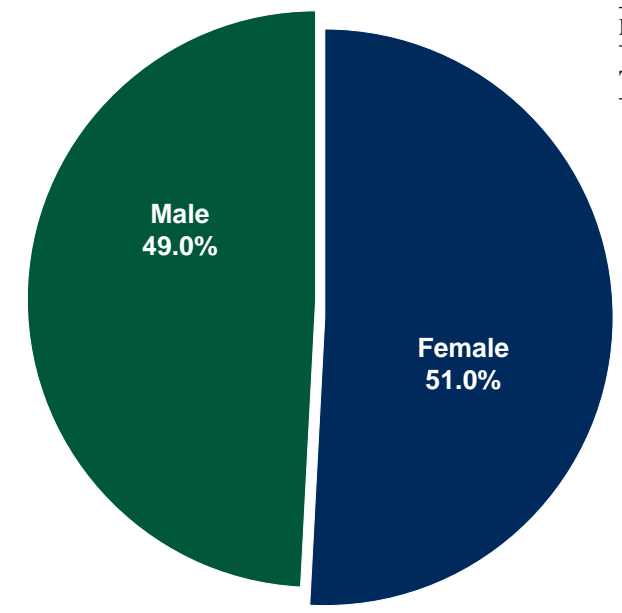

Characteristics of Education Abroad Students on Embedded/Faculty-Led Programs, 2009-10

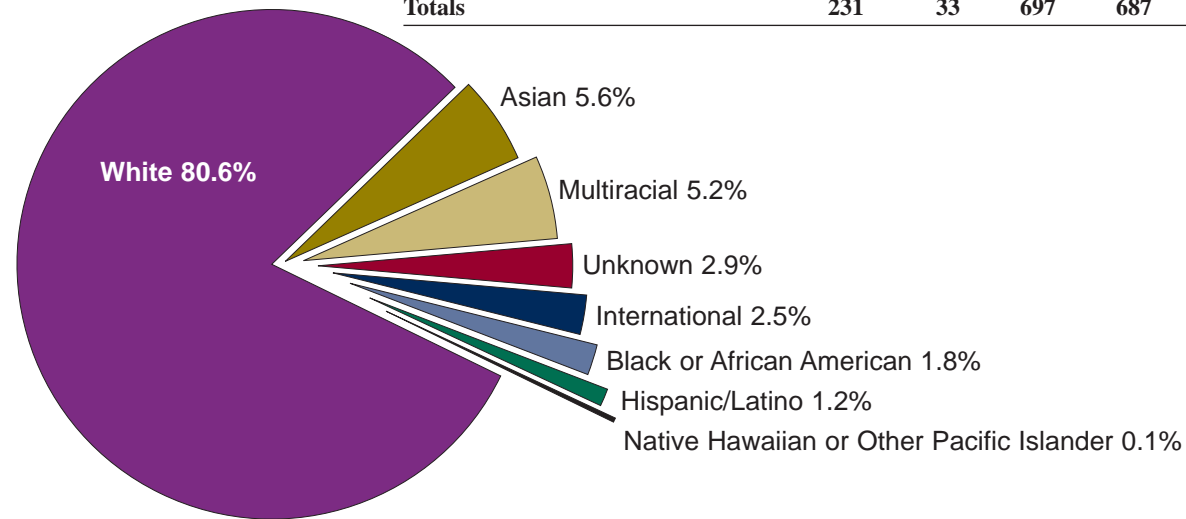

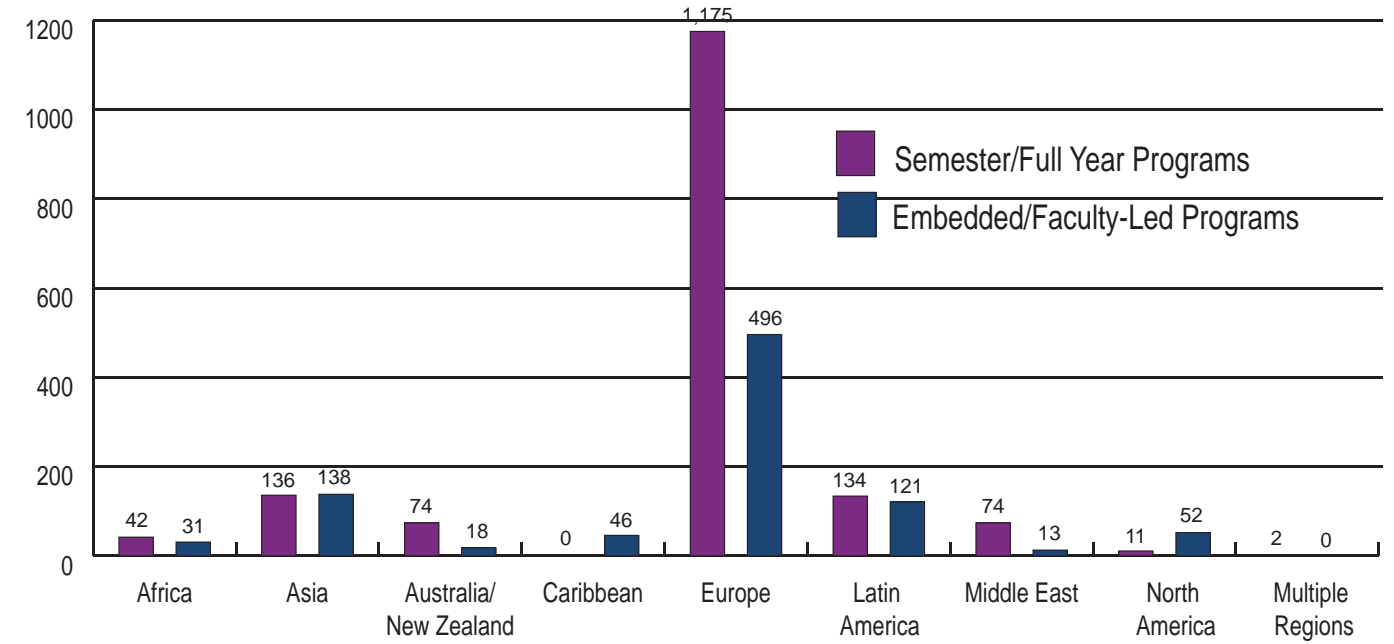

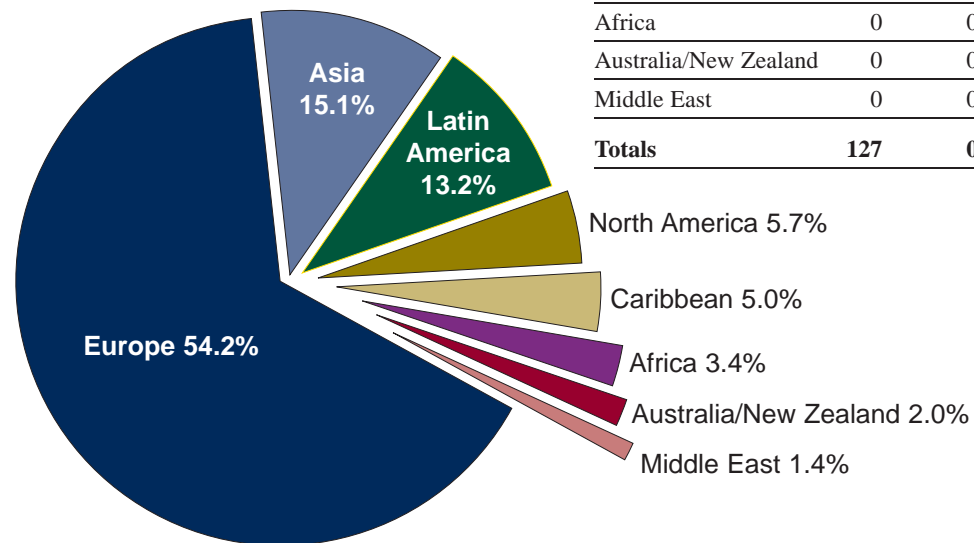


Enrollment in Semester/Full Year vs. Embedded/Faculty-Led Programs by Region, 2009-10

International Student Highlights for Fall 2010

- In Fall 2010, Penn State hosted 2,532 undergraduate students—a 30% increase from the previous year—and 2,395 graduate students (a slight decrease from 2009).
- In addition, there are 144 students in the Intensive English Communication Program, 6 students in the Turfgrass Certificate program, 5 students in the Professional Performance Certificate program, and 11 students in the Power Engineering program, for a total of 166 additional students.
- With the special populations added to the official numbers, there are 5,151 international students at Penn State.
- Colleges enrolling the largest numbers of international students are: engineering (26.5%), followed by business (13.2%), science (13%), and the liberal arts (8.6%).
- Penn State—University Park ranked 18th in 2009-10 among research universities and 8th among CIC institutions for numbers of international students with an enrollment of 4,561 in a student body of 44,406. In the CIC, the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign was first with 7,287 and a total enrollment of 43,723.
- International students at Penn State come from 128 countries. The five largest sending countries at Penn State are China (1,640), Korea (721), India (695), Taiwan (200), and Malaysia (163).
- 75% of our students are from Asian countries—this broadly reflects national trends.
- 144 international students from 21 countries study in the Intensive English Communication Program.
- Other campus locations with sizable international student populations are Penn State Harrisburg (129), Penn State Erie, The Behrend College (77), and Penn State College of Medicine at the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center (74). In addition, Penn State Altoona has 48 international students; Penn State York, 45; Penn State Abington, 42; and Penn State Berks, 28.
- Penn State is host to almost 563 students fully funded by their governments or private organizations. These sponsors include the ARAMCO Services Company, the Gulf States Cooperative Council, and countries such as Brazil, Malaysia, Mexico, Nigeria, Thailand, and Turkey.

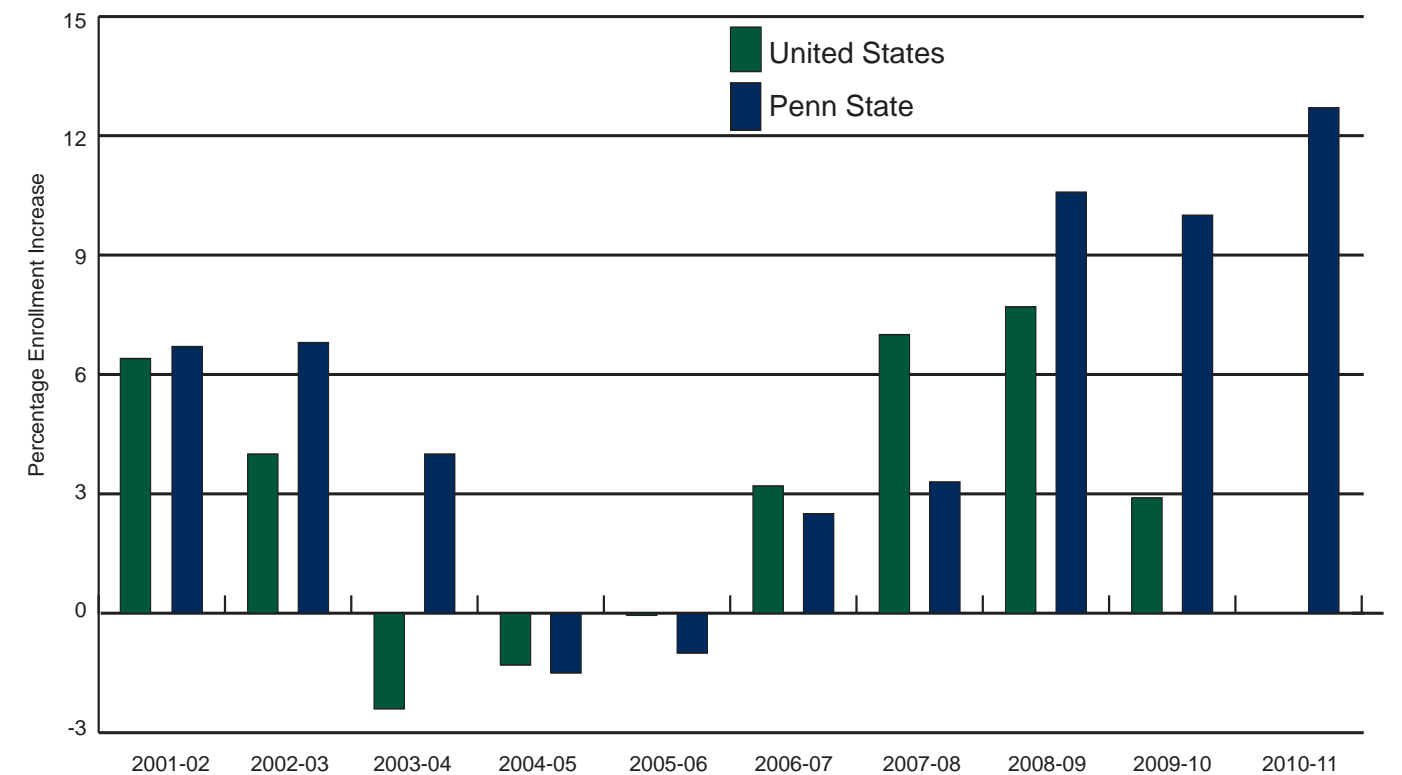

Comparison of International Student Enrollment Increases in the United States and Penn State, 2002-2011

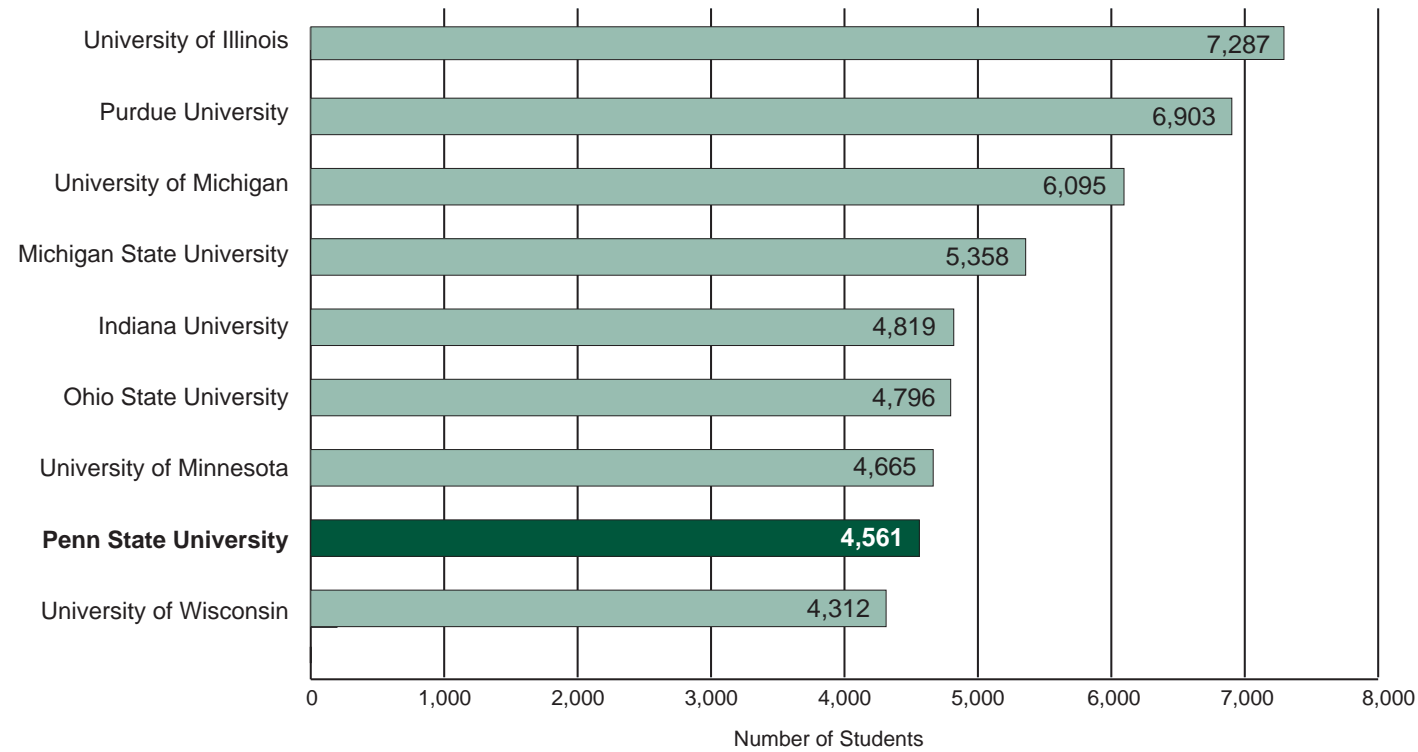

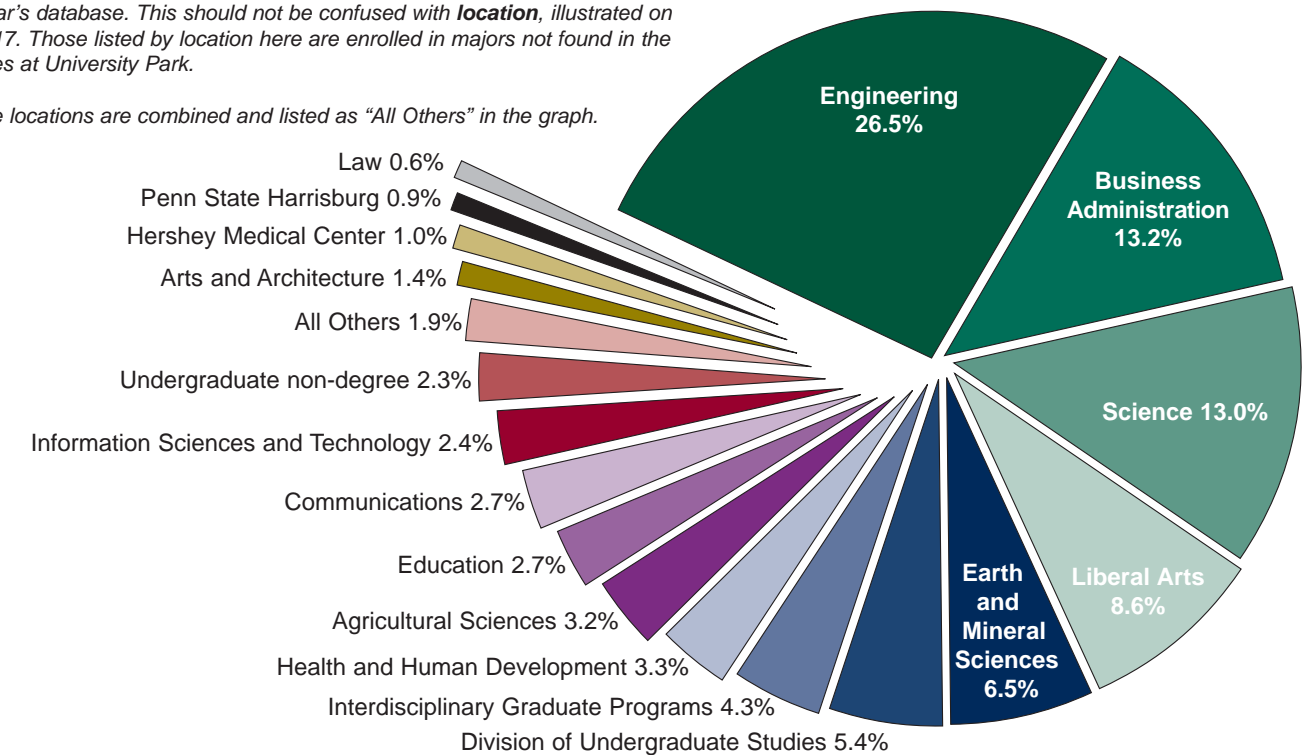

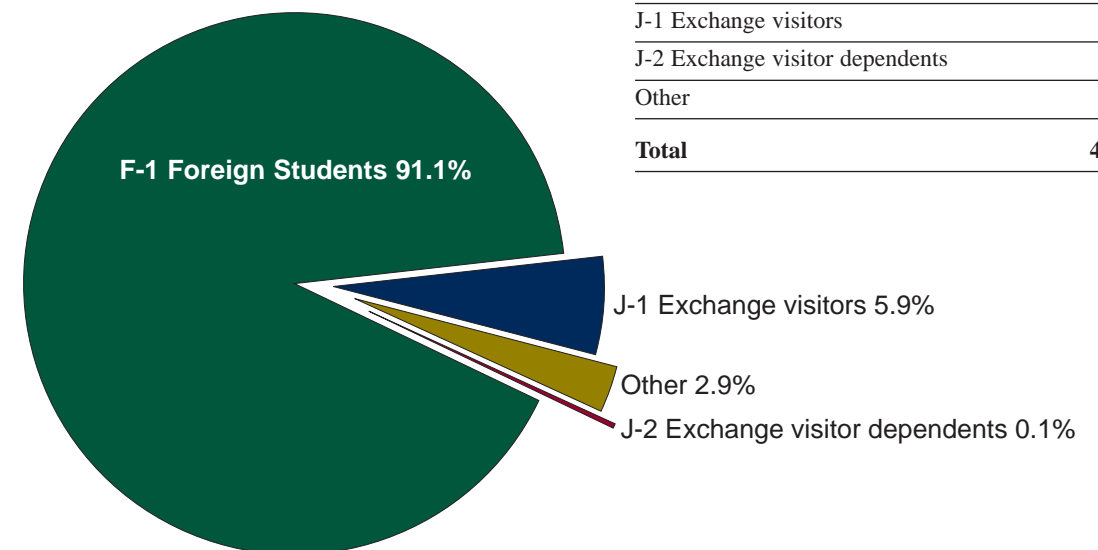

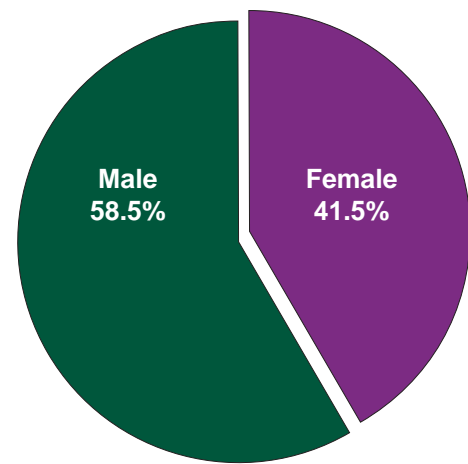

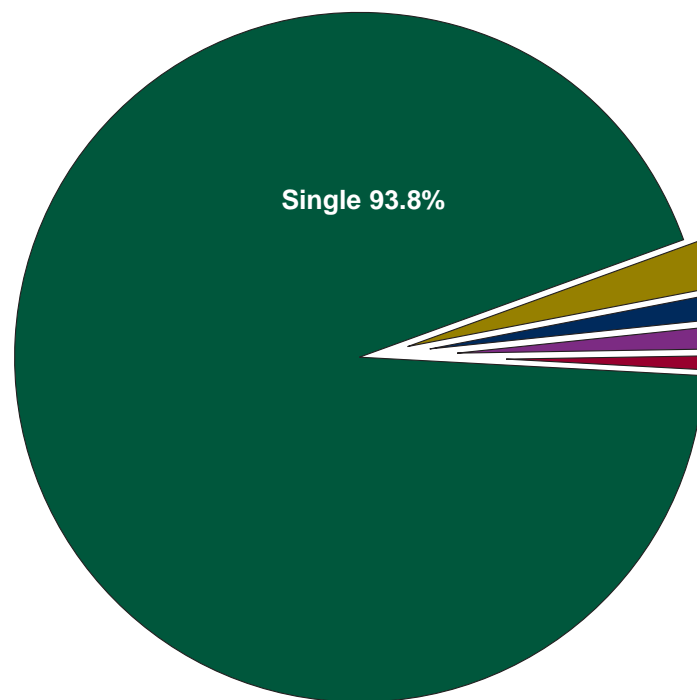


Gender

Nationality Representation of International Students, 2006-10

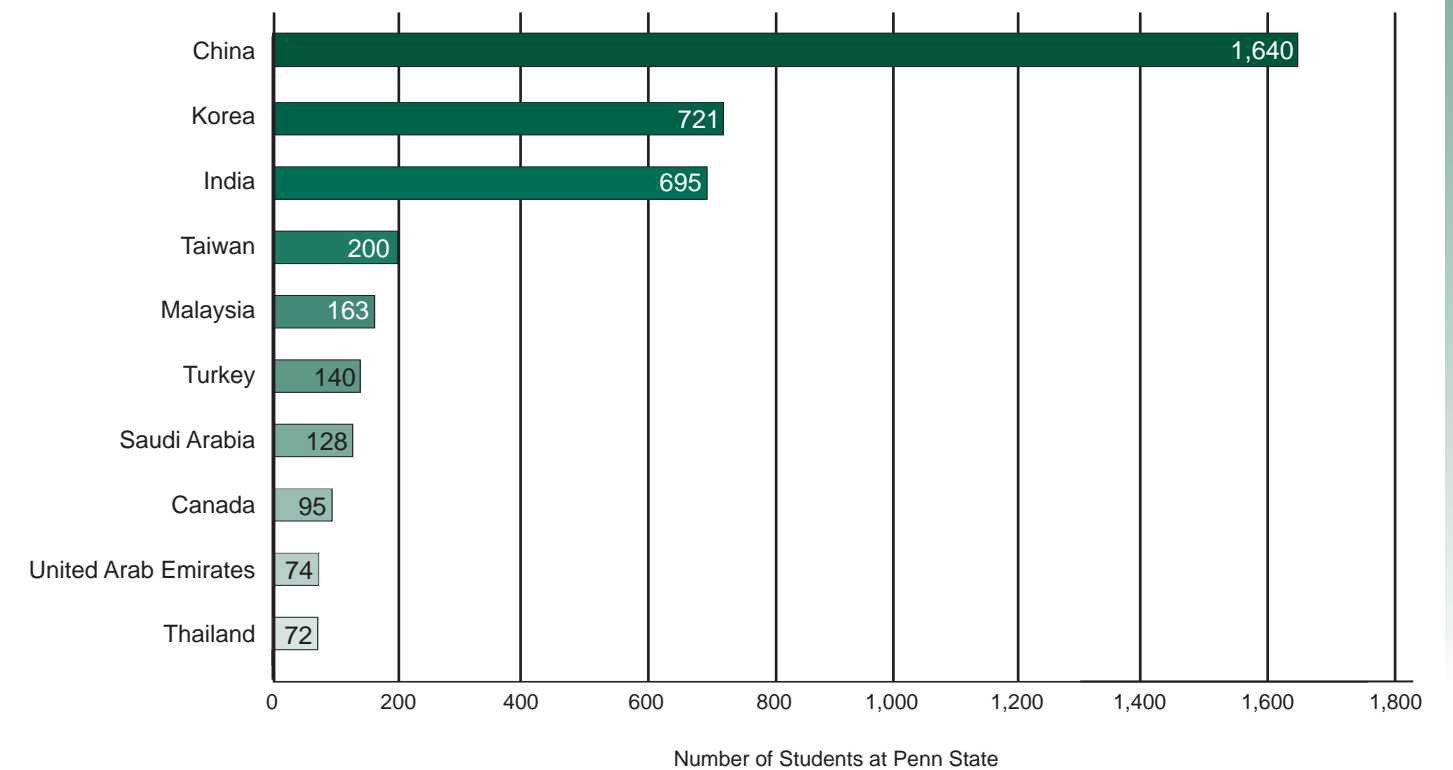

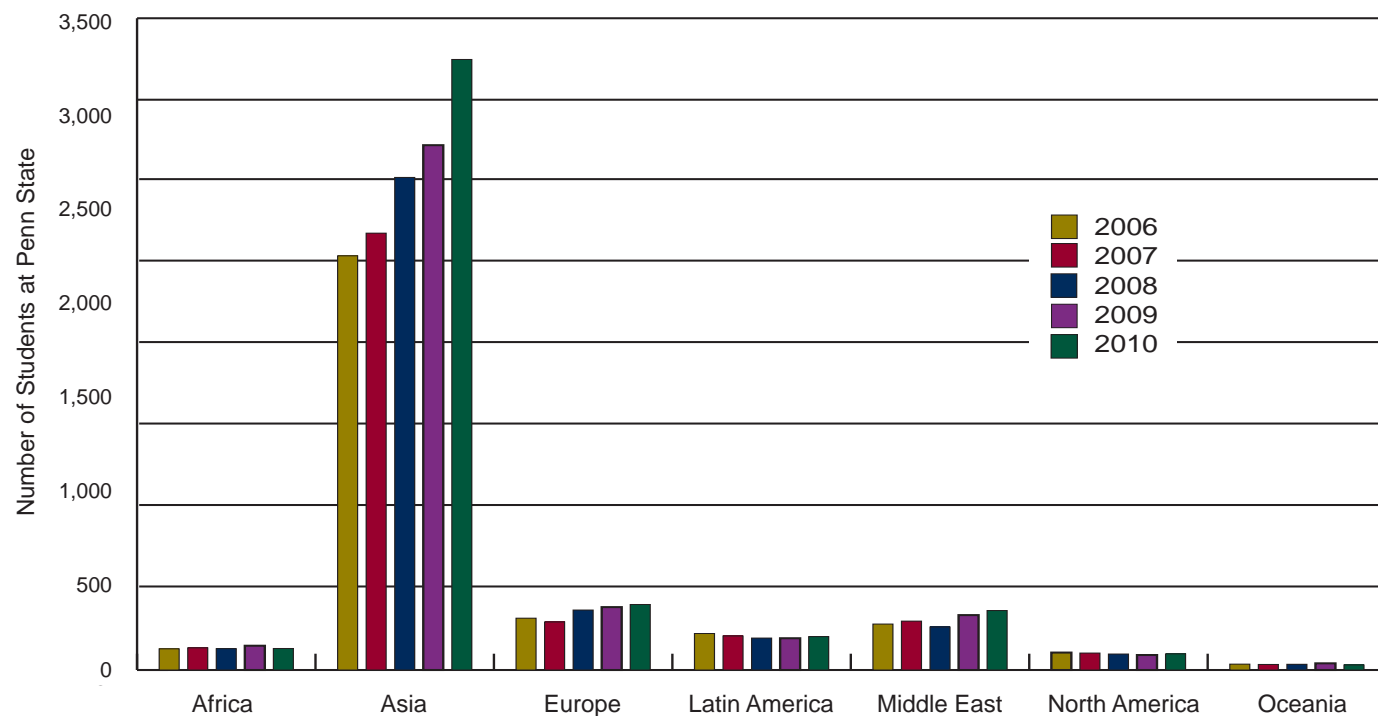

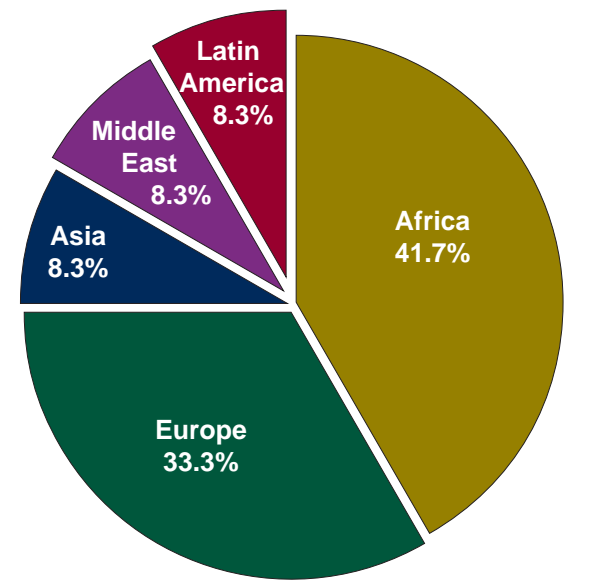
